PERSONNEL ORDER NO. 84-356

The Superintendent of Police, pursuant to the administrative authority vested in him, hereby suspends for thirty (30) days, effective 4 August 1984, Police Officer JOSEPH MIEDZIANOWSKI, Star 6751, assigned to Gang Enforcement North, after having determined that said member violated the following Rules of the Chicago Police Department.

C.R. #132767

RULE 2: In that on 27 July 1983, at approximately 2350 hours, at 4841 North Ashland, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski, while on duty, brought discredit to the Department by forcing his way into Mr. Andri Khoshaba's apartment and punching him in the face and chest, placed a firearm against Mr. Khoshaba's head and striking Mr. Khoshaba with a firearm without justification.

RULE 8: In that on 27 July 1983, at approximately 2350 hours, at 4841 North Ashland, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski, while on duty, did maltreat Mr. Andri Khoshaba in that he struck Mr. Khoshaba in the face, chest and arm.

RULE 9: In that on 27 July 1983, at approximately 2350 hours, at 4841 North Ashland, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski, while on duty, engaged in an unjustified verbal altercation in which he referred to Mr. Andri Khoshaba as a "motherfucker".

RULE 14: In that on 6 September 1983, at the Office of Professional Standards, at or about 1050 hours, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski did give false information to an investigator of the Office of Professional Standards relative to the incident of 27 July 1983.

RULE 37: In that on 27 July 1983, at approximately 2350 hours, at 4841 North Ashland, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski, while on duty, failed to correctly identify himself by giving his name, rank and star number, when asked to do so by Mr. Andri Khoshaba.

RULE 38: In that on 27 July 1983, at approximately 2350 hours, at 4841 North Ashland, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski, while on duty, unlawfully and unnecessarily displayed his weapon, in that he placed his gun against Mr. Khoshaba's head.

RULE 2: In that on 29 June 1984, at approximately 1050 hours, at 2914 West North Avenue, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski, while on duty, brought discredit to the

Department by throwing Reverend Jorge Morales to the ground, twisting Reverend Jorge Morales' arms, pushing Reverend Jorge Morales against a squad car, pushing Reverend Jorge Morales inside the squad car and intentionally pulling Reverend Jorge Morales by his hair without justification.

RULE 8: In that on 29 June 1984, at approximately 1050 hours, at 2914 West North Avenue, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski, while on duty, did maltreat Reverend Jorge Morales in that he twisted Reverend Morales' arms, threw Reverend Morales to the ground, pushed him against a squad car, pushed him inside the squad car and intentionally pulled Reverend Morales by his hair.

RULE 14: In that on 6 July 1984, at the Office of Professional Standards, at or about 1130 hours, Police Officer Joseph Miedzianowski did give false information to an investigator of the Office of Professional Standards relative to the circumstances under which Officer Miedzianowski arrested Reverend Jorge Morales.

In addition thereto, charges have been filed with the Chicago Police Board seeking the separation of the above cited member, or such other punishment as may be determined after a hearing by the Board, at which hearing the original disciplinary action taken by the Superintendent will also be reviewed.
